PD (7) 1 Moffat & Robins' Maibee Horatio, so promising for type & <u>compactness</u>, pretty straight <u>mover</u>, well marked on a pearly white background, can stand too wide in front but moves OK, head coming on well for age; 2 Johnston's Corrinwood Captain Jack, too long in back at the moment, well marked, lovely head, eyes set square to front of face. Nose pigment needs to fill in a touch, promising; 3 Sproul & Coburn's Khandro No Regrets.

JD (4) 1 Jackson & Fry's Amantra Treasury, compact, fair head, maybe lips could meet more exactly, lovely lozenge on head, quite a well made body who moves OK, but he does like to 'spin' on corners. Good body, topline & bone; 2 Champion's Stonepit Buster Keeton at Lankcombe, pleasing character, maybe a touch more stop would improve his muzzle, he is a wee bit upright in shoulders & would like clearer markings as he is quite ticked. Moved OK & lovely temperament; 3 Hunter's Maynorth Shades Of Heaven at Hooebarton.

PGD (7) 1 Coupland's Tucherish High Treason, holds himself proudly & is nicely compact & sturdy. He is too thin but nicely boned for size & well angulated. Moved well in <u>profile</u>, pleasing head & muzzle; 2 Matches' Baldragon Striding Edge to Fochai, would like to see more stop as nose is set too far in, good proportions, well marked, nicely boned, he too holds a good outline in profile; 3 Eddleston's Palandro Theodore. LD (8) 1 Sidgwick's Paulian Patented, a nice class! Winner nice to go over, pleasing conformation, liked his head & well set eyes, moderately large head & low set ears, good front & compact body, well angulated rear, moved well all round; 2 Wallhead's Sleepyhollow Trikki Dikki at Merida, beautiful head & expression, but just a slightly longer body than above & he needs a mite shorter loin. Well marked & shows OK moving, a little too <u>close</u> going away; 3 Bailey's Aldoricka The Maverick.

OD (7) 1 CC & BOB, Ryan's Ir Ch/Int Ch Charnell Brando at Cavalli, where this lovely dog scores is in his magnificent body, muscletone, sound free movement with such elegant carriage, pleasing head & muzzle with a definite stop, eyes set well, would just like a mite more neck but not too much! Well marked immaculate coat, sound legs & feet. A quality boy all through; 2 RCC, Moffat & Robins' Ch Maibee Theo, perhaps even better in head & expression & a lovely moving dog too, well marked, excellent angulation, level backline. Also a mite short in neck even for a medium length neck. Super quality also, not the muscletone & zest of above; 3 Mallows & Gillhespy's Binglui Berlington Bertie.

PB (8) 1 Sidgwick's Corrinwood Chloe at Paulian, lovely class! Winner compact, well domed head, good cushioning on muzzle, low set ears, sound front & rear, nicely marked, moves well all round; 2 Byers' Simannie Sweet Anneka, needs more practice with moving but also a super pup, beautiful head, well made decent body & moves soundly if erratically; 3 Willey & Siddle's Penemma Misty For Me.

JB (2) 1 Champion's Stonepit Lillian Gist at Lankcombe, very nice bitch indeed on her own, but I am sure she would have won in good company! Very precise moving with really top class hindquarters. Pleasing head & eye placement, muzzle wide & square, promising body, needs a wee bit more forechest.

PGB (7) 1 Mallows' Lorphil Red Ribbons, very good moving ruby, a bit scathy & undergroomed, but nice to go over, pleasing proportions & quality; 2 Pearson's Rexlands Crackle, better presentation than above but rather too long in back & she has a lot of ticking in her coat. Lovely head & expression, good temperament & she goes round very well, just a mite close in rear going away; 3 Coupland's Tucherish Julie Christie.

LB (7) 1 CC, Gillhespy's Downsbank Designed for Lorphil, good winner of this class! Liked her head & well cushioned muzzle, slightly too short in neck, would prefer it more medium in length, fair front, well marked & coat & body in beautiful condition, well set & carried tail, moving actively & was quite precise; 2 Eddleston's Palandro Thea, a bit of a jack in the box! I caught a glimpse of a nice outline & good

movement, but it was only now & then! I liked her head & muzzle, sound legs & feet, a little long for her height; 3 Baker's Cofton Walking On Sunshine.

OB (6) 1 RCC, Gurtner's Lux Ch Ellinor von der Gebhardshoh, nice girl, head could be a mite larger perhaps & her rear movement is a touch close. Lovely outline & carried herself well, good body & ribbing & coat in lovely bloom; 2 Bailey's Maibee Margot at Aldoricka, pigment not so good as winner & rear not so balanced with her front, well broken markings, in good body for age & moving with gusto; 3 Croome's Beauclerk Nora with Clovercourt.
