#### **PD (4 Entries) Abs: 1**

**1st: Waters & Robins' Maibee Mr Kipling. Well marked Tri, an easy winner here with beautiful head and a charming expression in his dark eyes, good finish to foreface, excellent pigment and big wide nostrils. Well balanced and beautifully presented in the best of coat and condition for his age. Very sound and positive on the move reflecting the excellence of his make and shape. Surely one for the very top. BP See he is champion bred, sired by the BOB and very similar.**

**2nd: Juniper's Lewiscarol Lord of The Dance. Another lovely Tri with decent layback of shoulder, full of bounce and all over the place in movement, did just enough to show that he can be very sound when he tries. Just not as mature or as well bodied as the winner as yet. His turn will surely come.**

**3rd: Maddison's Mitapip Midnight Marauder**

#### **JD (3 Entries) Abs: 0**

**1st: Schilizzi & Healy's Baldragon Royal Warwick of Chacombe. Tri, who scored over what transpired to be his litter brother on layback of shoulder and firmness at elbow. Lovely head and expression with big wide nostrils. He moved extremely well.**

**2nd: Johnson's Baldragon Only Way Is Essex. Loved his cobbiness in body and spring in his stride. More mature in coat than his brother and just had the edge on balance. Again, a beautiful head and expression with good nostrils. A hard choice between two high class youngsters.**

**3rd: L. Lord of The Dance**

**PGD (3 Entries) Abs: 1**

**1st: Robinson & Austin's Baldragon Hooray Henley. Blenheim. A very happy noisy character, full of fun with tail constantly awag and the very devil to show but his clever handler eventually persuaded him to prove he can move very well when he concentrates. Solidly built, in the peak of condition with excellent body and well laid shoulder, nose pigment could be darker, good finish to foreface.**

**2nd: Smith's Justacharma Oh So Magic JW. Charming small Tri with such a very serious expression he makes you want to smile, big wide nostrils, good topline, in excellent coat, just a touch shorter in neck than the winner. Sound and steady on the move.**

**LD (9 Entries) Abs: 2**

**1st: Mochrie's Downsbank Spruce. This Tri won here with something to spare. Cobby and well balanced with lovely head, eye, expression and pigment, in excellent coat with rich tan markings. So good for make and shape, he moved with style and steadiness, scoring on topline.**

**2nd: Tarabad & Tarabad's Lillijay Percy Cute Khatibi. Blenheim with good dark eye and layback of shoulder, well balanced, in good coat, a great showman. He went well.**

**3rd: Kendall & Askins' Headra's Chocolate D Lite**

**OD (7 Entries) Abs: 0**

**1st: Waters & Robins' Ch Maibee Theo. A glorious Tri, presented to perfection in superb coat and condition with clean, well broken markings. Full of quality, the most beautiful head with a melting expression in his dark sparkling dark eyes, big wide nostrils and excellent mouth. He is just as good as he looks to handle with all the parts fitting neatly and firmly into the whole the excellence of his confirmation being proved by his soundness in movement with good length of**

**stride in profile and constantly wagging, well set and carried tail. CC & BOB and later I was thrilled to see him awarded G4.**

**2nd: Fry & Jackson's Ch Amantra Cheers. Another gorgeous Tri, so full of type, mature and masculine, in fantastic coat and hard muscular condition. A great showman, holding himself with justifiable pride and obviously enjoying every moment to the full. Sound and stylish on the move. Most impressive. RCC**

**3rd: Mochrie's Downsbank Algenon**

**PB (6 Entries) Abs: 2**

**1st: Gurtner's Fleur de Lys de Melcourt. Tri with beautiful head, eye and expression, good layback of shoulder and firm body, well set and carried tail. Very sound and positive on the move. See that she is champion bred, sired by the impressive RCC dog. Most exciting. BPB**

**2nd: Robinson & Austin's Baldragon May Bea Baby, smaller Tri with well laid houlder, just a touch over enthusiastic with her tail at times. Rightly as yet still some maturing to do, she scored on the excellence of her movement.**
